



Louise E. Goyer Scholarship Policy

During her lifetime, Louise E. Goyer donated the sum of \$20,000.00 to St. Peter Lutheran Church for the purpose of providing financial assistance in the form of scholarships to members of St. Peter Lutheran Church, Greene, Iowa, that attend a Lutheran college. The gift document provides:

"... the income from this gift shall be used to provide scholarships to members of St. Peter Lutheran Church who are attending a Lutheran College. The gift is to be invested and the income may be accumulated over two or more years to provide larger scholarships or used annually for one or more students per the discretion of your Church council."

On November 7, 2002 the St. Peter Church Council adopted the following policy regarding this scholarship endowment. In March 2023 the council adopted changes to the scholarship endowment.

- The income from the Louise E. Goyer Scholarship Fund, herein referred to as the Goyer Scholarship, shall be accumulated for two years prior to the award of any scholarship(s). The first scholarship(s) shall be awarded for the academic year beginning in the fall of 2003 and each alternate academic year thereafter.
- **2.** The Goyer Scholarship Fund will be awarded yearly starting in 2014. When and or if the scholarship funds are depleted, we will then go back to every other year or until we have funds available. This will be decided on by the church council each March.
- 3. Any member of St. Peter Lutheran Church that is attending or will attend a Lutheran college may apply for a Goyer Scholarship.
- 4. The application must be filed with the St. Peter Church office before May 1 of any year that the Goyer Scholarship is awarded.
- 5. The application will be either be typed out and submitted in person or by mail to the church office, or, by email to the church office. The application should include the applicants full name, home address, email address, phone number to reach them directly, and the name(s) of the Lutheran college(s) they have applied to and intend to enroll. The application should include parent name(s) and contact information also. In addition, the applicant is required to provide a short essay outlining their reason for going to the college(s) identified and their potential majors or study intentions. A summary of their high school accomplishments and involvement can also be included in this essay.
- **6.** The Church Council will review the applications and determine the amount of the scholarship(s) to be awarded to each Applicant.
- **7.** The Goyer Scholarship funds will be distributed to the Applicant and the college upon proof of the Applicant's enrollment in a Lutheran college.

Lay members embrace new roles during transition

From preaching in the pulpit to sharing home communion visits, lay members are taking on new roles to carry out ministry when a pastor is not available.

HOME COMMUNION TEAM

St. Peter, Greene, has been without a called pastor since May 2022, so the congregation relies on supply pastors to offer Holy Communion once a month during the worship service. A team of lay members began extending that ministry in December to bring communion to the homes of members who aren't able to attend church and to residents of the nearby care center.

"Everyone on the team has a relationship with the people they are serving, whether it is an old neighbor or an old friend," says Jeff Dralle, who started the home communion team with his wife Pam and parish nurse Jo Ann Peterson. "The visits are quite rewarding."

About a dozen lay members comprise the St. Peter home communion team. Team members set up their own appointments to bring the communion elements to people in their homes and at the care center. Jeff and Pam prepare the pre- packaged communion kits and place them on the altar to be consecrated by the visiting pastor during the worship service. The pastor recognizes the team members at the altar and gives them a sending blessing. The volunteers complete their home communion visits over the next few days.

Dralle says he tries to be proactive in reaching out to members in their homes, rather than waiting for a communion request. "If someone hasn't been to church in a couple years, we will call them and explain how we are authorized to bring them communion," he says. "The key is for them to accept us as lay people delivering consecrated elements. These are sanctioned actions that are blessed by the ELCA."

The team members are paired with people they already know, so they take time to ask about their family, listen to any concerns and ask if they have any questions. They bring the Sunday bulletin and share about what is going on in the church. They also bring a printed liturgy to follow, and they take communion with those they visit — to share the body and blood of Christ with them.

"Our visits can easily consume an hour" Dralle says. "Pam and I like to hold hands with them and say the Lord's Prayer together. It creates a more meaningful service." These renewed friendships can extend beyond the communion visits. Team members will often make follow-up phone calls to those they have visited and send greeting cards to wish them well on special occasions.

Ninety-nine- year-old Norma Noel has always been connected to St. Peter Lutheran, where she taught Sunday school for more than 50 years and was baptized, confirmed and married. She continues to knit for the prayer shawl ministry, but in recent years she has been unable to attend worship services in person. St. Peter's pastor used to bring communion to her home whenever she requested; now, her old friend Sandra Ross brings communion to her each month as part of the home communion team. "It's wonderful," Noel says. "It feels so comforting, like bringing the church into my home."

Ross brings a doily to set the communion ware on to represent the altar. She visits with Noel, shares the liturgy, takes communion with her, and closes with a prayer. Ross phones Noel between visits to stay connected and see how she is doing. Ross says she initially didn't think she was worthy to give the sacrament. "After deep thought, I decided it was the least I could do for those who have missed getting communion," she says. "It is very humbling to serve my church in this manner. Each participant has expressed their gratitude, and I very much have been rewarded by the experience."

Noel says she still misses going to church, but she finds the communion visits to be refreshing and uplifting. "It's hard for a church to be without a pastor, but this group comes to your home and you feel they are a part of God's blessing that comes right with them."


