Sunday School Christmas Program

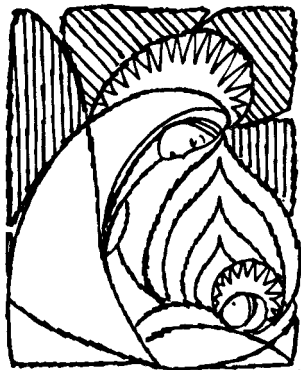
The 3 year old through 6th grade Sunday School children would like to invite you to their Christmas Program this year. The program will be held on December 15th at the 9:00 service.

Meeting date 11-4-24

- Laurie Shultz opened with devotion and prayer
- Laurie shared update from she and Monika on the giving envelope assessment. Of 166 sent each, 30 haven't given for years– need to contact them to offer options. Costs of envelopes (and especially mailings) are higher.
- The financial report in monthly newsletter only provides account balances, there's no reference to show income and expenses vs. budget we are behind in giving again this year and membership needs to be informed. Add that to the monthly financial reports to council and newsletter. Keith will provide this update to add to December newsletter.
 - Discussion about special offerings:
 - 1) recommendation is 25% Greene Food Bank, 25% ELCA World Hunger, and 50% Lutheran Disaster Response.
 - 2) Recommendation for Advent offerings is 100% Butler County Visions of Wellbeing Christmas Cheer project
 - Received the recommendation from Thrivent Choice committee– reviewed and approved to move forward to the Council.
 - Stewardship messages—discussed both temple talk options (Laurie and Keith) plus bulletin & newsletter additions (why I give testimonials like last year) - any council members are encouraged to send your messages to Keith.
 - 2025 budget will need to be approved initially at December council meeting, so committee additions are due to finance committee before 12/2
 - Memorial Giving list– last approved version was August 2023, time to review and add/update, Erin will bring to Council meeting in November
 - Keith provided an update on the ELCA Ministry Growth Fund investment return
 - mentioned that the loose offerings are to be collected 2nd and 4th Sundays, need to have the kids involved with passing the collection plates.
 - next meeting: Monday December 2 at 7 p.m

From the Stewardship & Finance Committee – Thank you for the support from our members in 2024, the response to the stained-glass window project was overwhelmingly generous and that project has now been successfully completed. We want to remind our friends and members of the importance to respond generously to the mission and budget support of St. Peter, too. Over the past 10+ years, our budget support has steadily declined, but we hope to encourage each of you to prayerfully consider your offerings as the year-end approaches to both bridge the gap in this year's revenue shortfall and increase for the future years. As you can read in the 2024 Income Statement below, we are behind in operating revenue support (which was already budgeted at a deficit for the year). Fortunately, the expenses are also lower for the year-to-date (YTD), which is helping our situation but we are still in a deficit spending situation. Thank you again for your interest and your consideration to support the work and outreach of St. Peter Lutheran Church

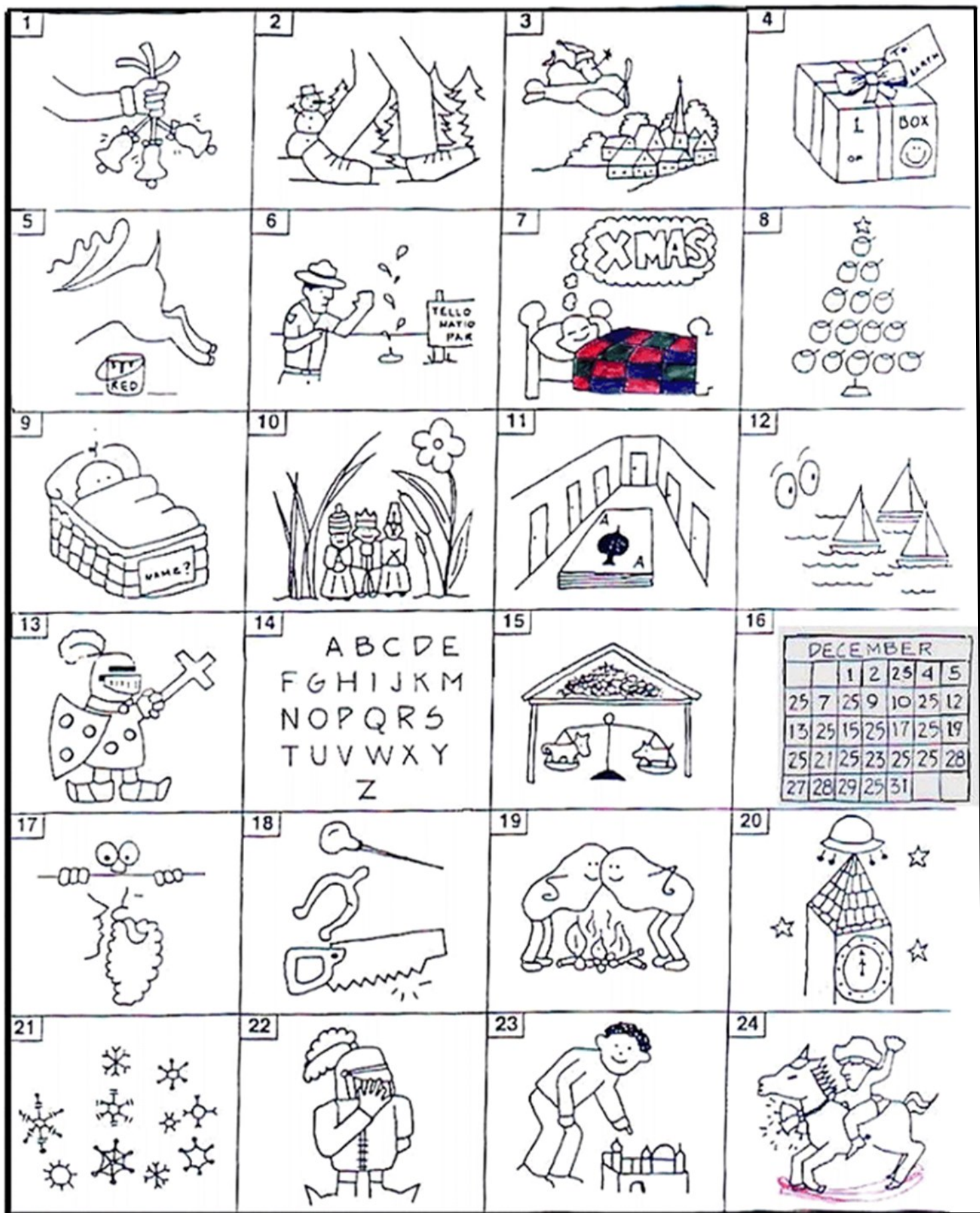
