2. Additions to the Agenda: K. New Members

3. Church Vision: The Advent Service was church vision this month.

4. Action Items: **A. COVID** Nothing new to report. **B. St Peters 150th Anniversary in 2022** February 16-19 pictorial directory pictures will be taken. The committee will be making phone calls to set up each family appointments. The next meeting is December 15th. **C. 2022 Proposed Budget** Council looked through the proposed budget for 2022. *Dawn made a motion to recommend approval of this budget to the Congregation at the Annual Meeting. Laurie Shultz on the Stewardship Committee and Mary Brinkman on the Worship Committee have requested to stay on the committee they are on for a 3rd term of 3 years. *Dawn made a motion to accept these requests. Chuck 2nd M/C* **G. Basement**

Restroom *Esther made a motion to change the signage on the basement restroom to "All Gender". Jan 2nd M/C*

H. Use of Fellowship Hall Use of the fellowship hall will continue reserved to members of St Peter through the church office. If anyone else from the community would like to use the hall, it will be subject to council approval. *Lindsay made a motion to make this change of reservations. Jan 2nd M/C* **I. Weather Closure Policy** Council reviewed the current policy, and a few things need to be updated.

J. Pastor furnishing/housing allowance of \$5,000 for 2022 Each year the congregation designates a portion of Pastor Daniel's salary as "Housing Allowance" meaning up to that amount is tax-free for income tax when used for housing and furnishing expenses. Money designated but not used is still taxable. Pastor is asking the allowance designation to be \$5,000, which is the same as last year. *Esther made a motion to keep the housing allowance designation the same as last year. Dawn 2nd. M/C* **K. New Members** 21 new members were welcomed on November 20/21 to our St Peter Congregation. *Lindsay made a motion to accept these new members. Clarene 2nd M/C*

5. Youth & Children's Ministry Report: Christin was not in attendance, but Pastor Daniel reminded us that the Sunday School Christmas program will be during the 6:00 pm Saturday service on December 11th in the Sanctuary. *Jan made a motion to accept the Youth & Children's Ministry Report. Esther 2nd M/C*

6. Pastor's Report: **a.** The sign-up sheet is up for *Simon Peter: Flawed but Faithful Disciple* by Adam Hamilton. This six-week study begins Tuesday, January 11th at 8:00 pm on Zoom. **b.** Reminder that all committee reports are due to Robin by January 3rd. **c.** Pastor Daniel requested to carry over 1 weekend for Continuing Ed from 2021 to 2022. **d.** Pastor Daniel and family will be leaving after the worship service on December 26th and returning either January 3rd or 4th. **e.** Thank you to Mary Brinkman for putting together the All-Saints Day bulletin board. **f.** Thank you Roland Martzahn for making the shelves in the table closet to hold the fellowship hall liturgical banners. **g.** Thank you to Jeff Dralle for arranging people to clean and to that group of people who did the cleaning. *Esther made a motion to accept the Pastor's report. Dawn 2nd. M/C*

7. Treasurer's Report: **a.** Two carpet rugs for the parsonage were purchased at a cost of \$235.00. **b.** Pastor Daniel needs to be reimbursed for the projector he purchased for the fellowship hall at a cost of \$353.09. *Dawn made a motion for these items to be paid. Jan 2nd M/C* **c.** The price of the *Portal of Prayer* booklets has gone up quite a bit. These have been sent quarterly in the newsletter to 285 households. Some have expressed interest in *Christ In Our Home* booklets. Orders will be placed for to both booklets to be available in the church to see the interest in them. **d.** We currently have an alarm system in case there are issues with heat and water. There is now also a unit available as a smoke alarm, which is free of charge. Buildings & Grounds will check into this. *Dawn made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report. Esther 2nd M/C*

8. Committee reports: Buildings & Grounds: **a.** Met on November 9th. A custodian has not yet been hired. The committee is dividing the church into zones and those volunteers are cleaning specific areas. The custodial duties have also been rewritten.

b. Advent displays are out. **Education & Youth:** Did not meet. **Stewardship and Finance:** Did not meet. **Worship and Evangelism:** The committee is taking on the task of looking at area churches for sanctuary technology upgrades. A group went to Immanuel United Church of Christ in Clarksville to see the set-up they have. There are 3 different companies lined up to come to the church on November 30th, December 2nd, and December 9th. Bids will be received from each of these companies. It is hopeful that a proposal can be given at the annual meeting. **Personnel:** Continuing to look for a custodian, and revision of the custodial duties. **WELCA:** Thank you to WELCA for providing fellowship after the midweek Advent Services. *Motion made by Lindsay to accept committee reports. Jan 2nd. M/C.*

Esther made a motion that the meeting be adjourned. Dawn 2nd. M/C Closed the meeting with the Lord's Prayer.

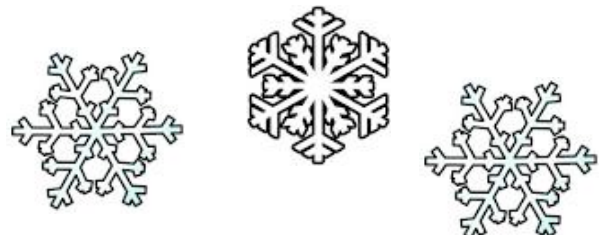

Entering Our 150th Anniversary Year

*Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations.
- Psalm 90:1*

Happy New Year! As you are hopefully aware, 2022 is our congregation's 150th anniversary year. Although this congregation wasn't formally organized until 1879, our history begins in 1872 with the concern of a handful of Lutheran immigrants in the area for raising up their families in faith and with Julius Nicolaus Anton Hildebrand's baptism on March 7, 1872.

This anniversary year gives us an opportunity to both reflect on and celebrate what God has done in this community in the past, and to consider what God is calling us to do now and in the future. My hope is that our anniversary celebrations this year can be more than just looking back at the past, more than patting ourselves on the back for a job well done. May this year's celebrations be a catalyst for future ministry as we seek to live out our faith in daily life. As the 1972 centennial book of the congregation says, "This history will not have served its purpose until you seek to be as faithful to Jesus Christ in the years ahead, as they were in the past."

Our theme verse for this year is Psalm 90:1, "Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations." This verse points to what it means to be a church. We're more than just a social club, or a service organization—we are the Body of Christ. Christ is our home. Our dwelling place now and for eternity is Christ, not a building. Our congregation of St. Peter is one tiny part of God's Church, all people redeemed by Jesus throughout time and space.

This congregation here has a rich history and tradition. Many of you have ancestors who have helped make this congregation what is today. Others of you are newcomers to St. Peter. All of us are called into this community by God to offer our own unique gifts and to accompany each other on the journey of faith. This church was here long before any of us were born and unless Jesus returns in glory in our lifetimes, the Church (and hopefully this congregation) will be here long after all of us have died. What a gift to be on this journey of faith together!

The Anniversary Committee is planning a variety of opportunities this year that I hope you'll participate in. The first one will be our **new church photo directory**. Although we're located in a small town, our congregation is certainly large enough that we don't all know each other. A directory helps us to build community and care for each other. By my count, we have had at least 80 members who have died or left our congregation and 79 who have been baptized or joined since our last church directory photos were taken in 2016. I hope you'll prioritize being a part of our new directory - watch for more information coming soon about how to be included, and mark your calendar for photo sessions on February 16-19.

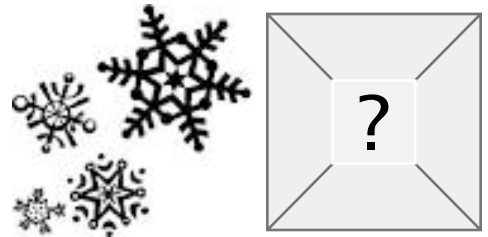

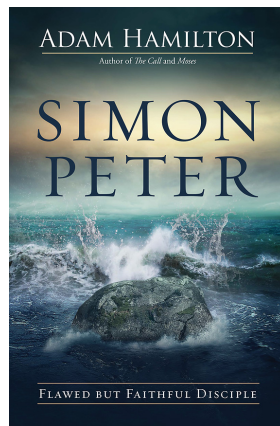


Online Bible Study

He left everything to follow his teacher and possessed a passion that would change the world. That's one way to describe Peter. Here's another: poor, uneducated, quick-tempered, and full of doubts and fears. Doesn't even sound like the same man. And that's the point of *Simon Peter: Flawed but Faithful Disciple*, a six-week adult Bible study by Adam Hamilton filmed largely on location in the Holy Land.

As we enter our congregation's 150th anniversary year, let's dig into the story of our namesake, Peter—an ordinary guy who heard and followed God's extraordinary call. In this study, discover how you, too, have special gifts, talents, and abilities that God can use to make a difference today.

Faith Vocab: Epiphany

An "Epiphany" is a sudden revelation. It's that moment when you suddenly realize something, when an idea becomes clear to you. In a cartoon, it'd be the moment when the light bulb blinks on above a character's head!

In the church year, Epiphany is a holiday marking the arrival of the wise men from the East (also known as the Magi) who came to visit Jesus. Epiphany is on January 6th, the 13th day after Christmas. The image of Epiphany is light, representing the star that guided the Magi as they searched for the newborn king. Light is also an appropriate image for the holiday as these foreign travelers are the first to recognize that the baby Jesus is God's light shining in the world, revealing to everyone who God is.

In our tradition, Epiphany is an minor holiday and a chance to sing *We Three Kings*, but in some places like Poland, Sweden, parts of Germany, Epiphany is an official public holiday.

Sanctuary Technology Updates

For nearly two years now, Pastor Daniel has been using his computer and phone to make the weekly sermon and Scripture available online, which has been watched and appreciated by members of our congregation and community. This spring, the Worship Committee began a discussion about what the next step in updating our technology might be.

In April, the Church Council voted to form a committee of people interested in investigating what equipment might be needed and how it may be used to enhance our worship services. Specifically, we are looking at putting in screens on the sides of the sanctuary to make it easier to follow along with worship, and cameras and equipment to give us the ability to livestream and record services.

Since May, our committee has talked with Audio/Video companies, looked at what other churches in our area are doing, and even visited another church to see their setup in person. This research has helped us define what would work well for our congregation of St. Peter. Three companies have looked at our sanctuary and talked with us about what improvements might be made, and they are currently preparing bids for us to move forward.

Once we have bids, the next step will be presenting the congregation with a proposal to be voted on at the annual meeting on January 30. The vote at the annual meeting will be on whether or not to move forward with the project and on how to pay for it, likely with some combination of memorial and restoration funds on hand and asking for new donations. We'll have much more information about the proposed equipment and cost to share with you in the next few weeks before the meeting, so please watch for that at church in early January.

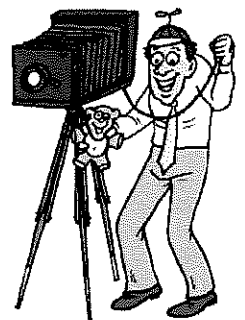
