Members Present: Owen Almeliën, Cheryle Arjes, Keith Christensen, Dana Frerichs, Dixie Hughes, Erin Mulder, Jan Osier, Dawn Van Etten and Phil Wahlgren. **Member Absent:** Andrea Gotto, Lindsay Landers and Tracy Steere **Also Present:** Gale Brinkman (Treasurer), Robin Majewski, Mike Kleinfelter, Monika Teeple and Becky Liddle

1. Secretary's Minutes: *Keith made a motion to accept the Secretary's report Cheryle 2nd M/C*

2. Mike Kleinfelter – Mike Kleinfelter gave a presentation on the Ministry Growth Fund of the ELCA Endowment Fund Pooled Trust. It is a long-term, stable and social responsible endowment fund that provides distributions to grow ministry, now and in the future. He went over how the fund works, and the benefits for participation. The council is considering using this Pooled Trust for the Hildebrand Endowment and part of the Goyer Scholarship Fund to receive higher rates of return.

3. Additions to the Agenda: Sound system, Shut-in visits, Hymnals, Custodian, Fellowship

5. Action Items: **A.** Harvest Offering – The Stewardship committee has suggested that the Harvest Offering be divided as: 25% ELCA World Hunger, 25% Greene Food Bank and 50% Lutheran Disaster Response. *Keith made a motion to divide the offering as suggested by the Stewardship Committee. Dawn 2nd M/C* **B.** Worship Servants – Each month, council members are taking turns getting the church open and ready for Saturday night and Sunday services. The month of October is Andrea. Andrea will be contacting those who has volunteered to usher and lector to remind them of their dates. Please let the office know, or the council member in charge if you are not able to volunteer on your week. **C.** Lay Members - If anyone in the church is comfortable helping at services when we do not have a visitation pastor, please let Erin or Robin know. We are fortunate to have Keith step in as needed, but it may not always work in his schedule. **D.** Tree Removal – There are 2 dead trees in front of the church and 1 tree at the parsonage that will be taken down. Jeremy Miller has given an estimate \$850.00 per tree. *Dana made a motion to contact Jeremy Miller to remove the trees. Cheryle 2nd. M/C* **E.** Sound System – The company that has been hired to install the new sound system has started. They are right now waiting for the electrician, so there may be further delay until November. **F.** There is a need to have shut-in communion start again. By the first of November, it is hoped that a group will start visiting and distributing communion to our shut-in members. **G.** Hymnals – Worship and Evangelism will review whether it's time to change hymnals.

H. Custodian – Our church custodian, Becky attended the meeting to request the purchase of a rechargeable stick vacuum to use in the Sanctuary. This type of vacuum is more mobile and would save time with the vacuuming. *Jan made a motion that Becky could make this purchase of a vacuum for no more than \$250.00. Phil 2nd M/C* **I.** Fellowship – Dana brought up that now that Sunday School has started, we should have more consistent Fellowship after worship on Sunday mornings. Erin offered to host fellowship for Sunday October 9th. This will be added to the clipboard for volunteers to sign up.

7. Treasurer's report: The Goyer Scholarship had a CD come due & Gale put it into a 3-month CD. At the end of the CD term council will decide what the amount will be to invest with the Ministry Growth Fund. *Dawn made a motion to accept the Treasurers Report. Jan 2nd M/C*

8. Committee reports: **Call Committee:** The site profile form has been sent to the Synod. Kelly Hoodjer will follow-up on the progress. **Buildings & Grounds:** Met September 28th. a. John Barth removed damaged tile at the back door of the old basement. Replacement flooring to be determined, either tile or carpet. The replacement door needs to be installed. b. The ash tree removal estimate from Jeremy Miller is \$850.00 per tree. Phil is going to try to treat and save the smaller tree. c. Roland power washed the deck at the parsonage. Some committee members will seal it. d. All the parsonage projects are finished, but the roof needs to be re-shingled at some point in the future. e. Carol Barth has been cleaning the church while Becky recovers from a medical procedure. Becky has been starting back cleaning in small steps. **Education & Youth:** a. Luther League will meet October 12 at St James. On October 23rd they will be doing the highway 14 garbage pickup. b. The new can receptacle is in place and looks very tidy. Hopefully will be kept neater. c. Confirmation is going well. d. Sunday School attendance is low, 21 students last Sunday. **Stewardship and Finance:** Met September 26th a. Mike Kleinfelter of the ELCA Foundation will be at the October 5th council meeting regarding the ELCA Ministry Growth Fund giving information about endowment asset options. He is also willing to hold an educational seminar for others in the congregation and community that may be interested in investment options/gift giving. b. Gale provided a breakdown of the last 5 years of gift giving per household to better help with budget planning in the future. c. The 2023 budget meeting will be the first part of November. d. Our next meeting will be October 31 at 7:00. **Worship and Evangelism:** Met Monday, October 3rd. Christmas Eve service will be at 5:00 with Pastor Kent Mechler. **Personnel:** Did not meet. **WELCA:** a. Country Time serviced approximately 750 meals, so it was successful!

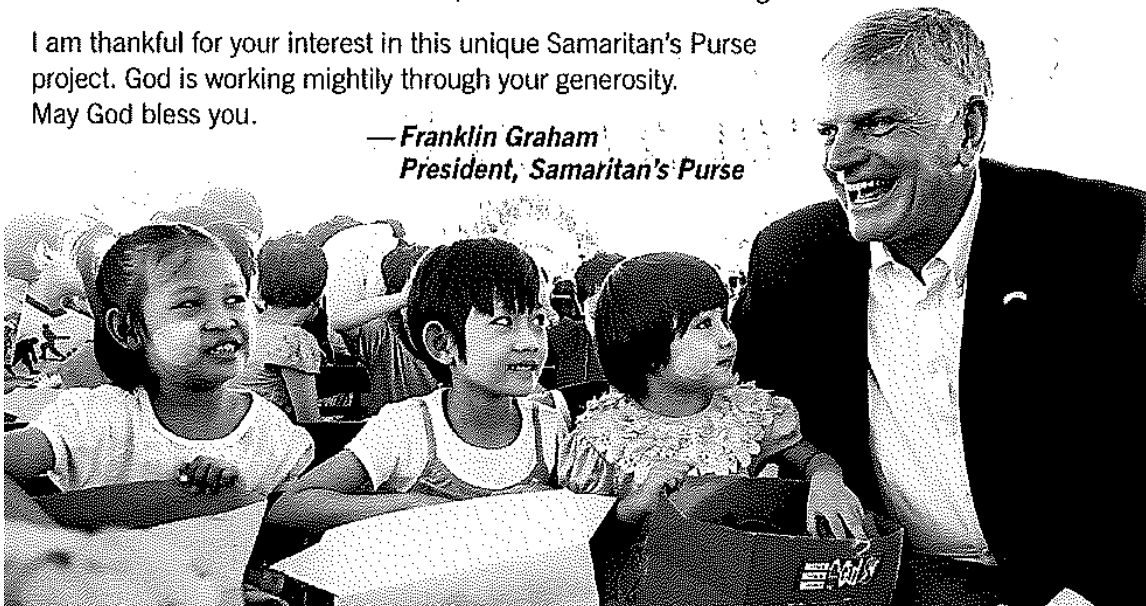

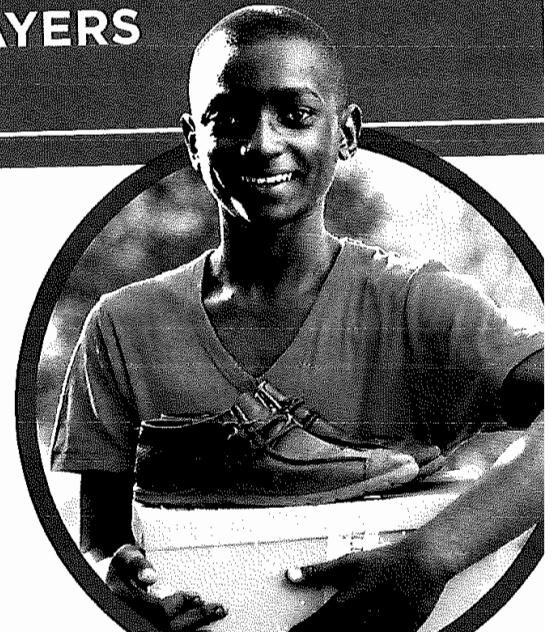

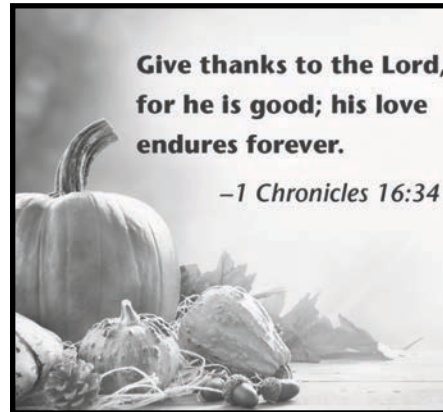
